Third Sunday of Easter
May 1, 2022



Could it be that God's image has become so soiled and distorted that it is hard for us to see it? Our self-serving agendas have done a great job twisting God's image into what profits us. We want our agenda to be God's agenda and use prayer as the convincing leverage we need. Worse still, our success and egocentric agenda often erases God's image completely, replacing it with our own. St. Oscar Romero instructs us that the Son of Man "dies on the cross to cleanse God's image, which is soiled in today's humanity, a humanity so enslaved, so selfish, so sinful." Striving to preserve control of our destinies at all costs, we fail to see the risen suffering servant, the Christ, standing right beside us. Jesus, who suffered and died on a cross and was raised from the dead, corrects our soiled image of God. He shows us God as God is, not who we want to make God to be. God is the God of the poor, the weak, and the marginalized. He is the God who tenderly caresses us when we are suffering and hurting, assuring us that all will be safe and well. He is the God of equity, peace, justice, and compassion who wants happiness for each of His children, desiring their wellbeing and success. God goes where men and women are afraid to go, sitting with the lost, the broken, and the sorrowing. St. Oscar Romero challenges us to illuminate with "Christ's light ... even the most hideous caverns of the human person: torture, jail, plunder, want, chronic illness. The oppressed must be saved." The resurrection calls us to be God's microphone, a messenger, and a prophet (St. Oscar Romero). Using eyes that see beyond the limited constructs and desires of our world, we can see the true and real Jesus standing before us, calling us to transformation and change. Asking us more than once, "do you love me?" We are beckoned to give an answer. Answering in the affirmative, it is now our task to feed the sheep and the lambs who belong to God. In short, equipped with the power of the resurrection and a corrected image of God our task is to make things better, brighter, holier, more life-giving, and just for all of God's children. Considering our choices, our interactions, our philosophies, and aspirations, how can we do this?

Gifts in Disguise

Have you ever opened a gift and wondered what the giver was thinking? I won't call out any of my family or friends here, but suffice to say, I think we have all been the confused recipient of a sweater that wasn't our size or a gift card to a store where we don't shop. But we smiled all the same and said how much it meant to us, because we know that when it comes to gifts, it's all about the gesture. Suffering is a lot like that — the gift you never asked for, and don't really want to receive. Sometimes we look at suffering and, like the apostles who see Jesus as a stranger on the shore, we don't recognize it for what it can be. We don't appreciate the catalyst suffering can be for change, for growth, for grace. What was the gift that you received in disguise? Was it a relationship that confounded and frustrated you? Was it a job that tested your spirit? An obstacle that stopped you dead in your tracks? A rejection that threatened to break your spirit? If I go back and look at the worst gifts I've ever gotten, chances are that I didn't like them because I didn't know what to do with them — they were more fitted for someone else's interests, someone else's life. It's the same with suffering. We're tempted to cast suffering aside when it comes our way because it doesn't fit the person we are. Suffering is made to fit the person God knows we have the ability, with His grace, to become. Hang onto that suffering. Unlike the misshapen sweater, it really will come in handy.

LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD DIARIA

Regalos disfrazados

¿Alguna vez as abierto un regalo y te preguntaste qué estaba pensando el donante? No pondré en evidencia a ninguno de mis familiares o amigos aquí, pero basta con decir que creo que todos hemos sido el destinatario confuso de un suéter que no era de nuestra talla o una tarjeta de regalo para una tienda donde no compramos. Pero sonreímos de todos modos y dijimos lo mucho que significaba para nosotros, porque sabemos que cuando se trata de regalos, lo importante es el gesto. El sufrimiento es muy parecido a eso: el regalo que nunca pediste y que realmente no quieres recibir. A veces miramos el sufrimiento y, como los apóstoles que ven a Jesús como un extraño en la orilla, no lo reconocemos por lo que puede ser. No apreciamos el catalizador que puede ser el sufrimiento para el cambio, el crecimiento, la gracia. ¿Cuál fue el regalo que recibiste disfrazado? ¿Fue una relación que te confundió y frustró? ¿Fue un trabajo que puso a prueba tu espíritu? ¿Un obstáculo que te detuvo en seco? ¿Un rechazo que amenazaba con romper tu espíritu? Si vuelvo atrás y miro los peores regalos que he recibido, lo más probable es que no me gustaron porque no sabía qué hacer con ellos; eran más adecuados para los intereses de otra persona, para la vida de otra persona. Lo mismo ocurre con el sufrimiento. Estamos tentados a dejar de lado el sufrimiento cuando se nos presenta porque no encaja con la persona que somos. El sufrimiento está hecho para adaptarse a la persona que, Dios sabe, que tenemos la capacidad de convertirnos con Su gracia. Aférrate a ese sufrimiento. A diferencia del suéter deforme, realmente será útil.

1º de mayo de 2022



La alegría de la resurrección sigue en nuestras asambleas litúrgicas. Las oraciones y alabanzas, junto con la antífona de entrada, nos ayudan a reflexionar en ello: “Aclamen al Señor, habitantes todos de la tierra, canten un himno a su nombre, denle gracias y alábenlo. Aleluya”. Se apareció resucitado a sus discípulos en Galilea. Les preparó un suculento desayuno y les invitó diciendo: “Vengan a desayunar. Ninguno de los discípulos se atrevió a preguntarle quien era, pues sabían que era el Señor. Jesús se acercó, tomó el pan y se lo repartió. Lo mismo hizo con los pescados” (Juan 21:12-13). “Esta fue la tercera vez que Jesús se apareció a sus discípulos después de resucitar de entre los muertos” (Juan 21:14). Tres veces les saluda brindándoles su paz, y les prepara el desayuno. Luego de desayunar, Jesús le pregunta a Pedro si lo ama. Tres veces fue la pregunta y Pedro responde tres veces la misma respuesta: “Sí, Señor, tú sabes que te quiero”. A lo que Jesús agrega como respuesta: “Cuida, y apacienta a mis ovejas”. Cada domingo en la Eucaristía, el Señor nos hace la misma invitación. Vengan, vengan católicos al banquete celestial. No sean sordos a mi invitación. Cuiden y apacienten a su familia, a sus amigos y a las personas sin voz. El Evangelio del resucitado es acción, y movimiento repleto de justicia y esperanza. Seamos como Pedro que lloró amargamente el haberle negado tres veces el Viernes Santo. Y ahora, en este episodio, su compromiso filial es amar al Señor hasta el martirio. ¿De qué forma profesamos nuestro amor a Jesucristo? ¿Cuál será el compromiso para toda la vida?

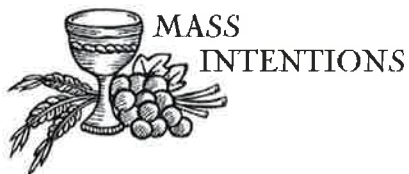
